### Nancy Brewer Retires

Nancy Brewer, the first full-time Children's Librarian for Ledyard Library will retire on December 31. She began as a Library Assistant in 1988 and when the Children's opening came up she applied and was hired. During her tenure she prepared scores of children for kindergarten with story times, encouraged children to read over the summer with programs and helped numerous children and teens find information for a school project. We are collecting photos, stories, and good wishes for Nancy's memory book. **Q. You have worked at Ledyard Library for 31 years. How has it changed in that time?**

A. I have been privileged to serve the people of Ledyard/Gales Ferry for many years. I have seen some wonderful programs begin and continue to grow. The growth of online resources has been challenging to keep up with because of the quickness of new applications and social media sites. But people still love books!! I have seen children's attention spans shorten and the need for more entertainment in storytimes, rather than simply reading books to them.

**Q. What has been the most challenging part of working here?**

A. I believe the most challenging aspect is trying to fit all my Storytimes (16 per month)/preschool visits (20 per month) and preparations for those programs into my regular schedule, along with having to work hours on the circulation desk because of staff reduction. I still need to keep up with book ordering/weeding/shelving, going through endless magazine reviews, PR opportunities like Ledyard School visits or community outreach, extra programs such as the Giving Tree, Trunk or Treat, Summer Reading Program preparation and implementation.

The Coding Club will continue to meet during the school year, on the first Thursday of each month at Gales Ferry Library. Children will learn how to code Ozobots using the Ozoblockly interface, incorporating simple variables and functions.

## Coding Grant received

The Library was one of 50 applicants chosen from a field of 250 to receive a Coding Club grant. The grant, valued at \$4500 will provide code club software for one year along with coaching and training for library staff on how to use the software. We have committed to providing a facilitator, computers, space, and a dedicated meeting time for Code Club to meet throughout the next year. We will be expanding the club from monthly sessions to weekly sessions beginning in February, 2020. The Coding Club is suitable for all students ages 8 – 18 and will alternate between Bill and Gales Ferry.

The grant was made available to small & rural libraries through the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), North Dakota State Library, Linda Braun, Crystle Martin, and Prenda.


